**Announcement by Chiang Mai University**  
**Application for Admission to the International and Bilingual**  
**Undergraduate Programs**  
**for the 2019 Academic Year**

Chiang Mai University is now accepting applications for Chiang Mai University's International and Bilingual Programs for the 2019 academic year.

**The 9 international programs that are open for admission are:**

- Bachelor of Arts in Social Science (SS)
- Bachelor of Arts in Thai as a Foreign Language (TFL)
- Bachelor of Economics (ECON)
- Bachelor of Engineering in Information Systems and Network Engineering (ISNE)
- Bachelor of Engineer in Mechanical Engineering (ME)
- Bachelor of Science in Digital Innovation (DIN)
- Bachelor of Science in Integrated Design in Emerging Architecture (IDEA)
- Bachelor of Science in Software Engineering (SE)
- Bachelor of Nursing Science (NSC)

**The 2 bilingual programs that are open for admission are:**

- Bachelor of Science in Animation and Game (ANI)
- Bachelor of Science in Modern Management and Information Technology (MMIT)

Note: For international students in bilingual programs, English is used as the medium of instruction in all courses.

**Eligibility:**

1. Thai applicants who are currently studying in or graduated with *Mattayom Suksa 6* certificate are eligible to apply for all programs **except** NSC, TFL, ANI, MMIT.
2. Thai applicants who have graduated from an international program or from abroad with high school equivalency certificate or have a foreign high school equivalency certificate are eligible to apply for all programs **except** TFL.
3. Non-Thai applicants who have graduated with a high school equivalency certificate are eligible to apply for all programs.

**Applications must be made through the International Program Admission System (IPAS) which provides two Tracks for applicants:**

**Track 1:** For applicants who are able to take the internal examinations for specialized subjects and the CMU-English placement test at a designated test center.

**Track 2:** For applicants who are unable to take the internal examinations at CMU test centers but can provide results of their standardized examinations for English (see item 2 below) and the specialized subjects (see item 3.4.2 below). This Track is available for all programs except the **Social Science program**.

Chiang Mai University is accepting applications in 4 Intakes. Please note that each Intake has a specific application period, programs accepting applications, and Tracks as follows:

Note: Applicants in the **1<sup>st</sup> Intake for ECON and DIN** will be arranged for an online interview and must submit a portfolio with additional requirements listed in the item 6.8 and 6.9 in this announcement.

## 1. GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

- 1.1 Applicants must have no record of serious misconduct and agree to strictly follow the rules and regulations of the university.
- 1.2 Applicants must not have a serious contagious disease or any disease that will obstruct their studies.
- 1.3 Additional Health Qualifications for **Nursing Science program**, applicants must be in good health, with no illnesses, symptoms, or disabilities which would be an obstacle to their studies. Applicants with the following illnesses, symptoms, or disabilities are ineligible for admission:
  - 1.3.1 Any disability which is an obstacle to study.
  - 1.3.2 Severe psychiatric problems including psychotic disorders, autistic spectrum, mood disorders, severe neurotic disorders, personality disorders such as antisocial personality disorders or borderline personality disorders, or other psychiatric problems which are obstacles to study, practice, and work as a professional nurse.
  - 1.3.3 Any contagious disease in the transmission phase which can be a danger to yourself, the patients, or cause permanent disability which in turn will be an obstacle to study, practice, and work as a professional nurse.
  - 1.3.4 Non-communicable diseases or disorders which are an obstacle to study including:
    - 1) Uncontrolled epilepsy.
    - 2) Severe heart disease which is obstacle to study, practice, and work as a professional nurse.
    - 3) Severe hypertension with permanent complications to any organ.
    - 4) Chronic kidney disease.
    - 5) Substance use disorder.
    - 6) Visual problems including severe color blindness, or having visual acuity in your good eye of less than 6/12 or 20/40 after correction.
    - 7) Sensory neural hearing loss of a hearing threshold above 40 dB at 500-2,000 Hz.
    - 8) Other diseases or disabilities which the physical examination committee determines as an obstacle to study. The Dean of the Faculty of Nursing may request an expert to help conduct further assessment.

## 2. ENGLISH PROFICIENCY QUALIFICATION

2.1 Applicants who are Native English Speakers and from a country where English is an official language are exempted from the English Proficiency requirement, but will still be required to take entrance examinations as specified by individual program.

2.2 Applicants who are Non-Native English Speakers or from a country where English is not an official language must submit one of the following English Language Standard Certificates with a minimum score required by their selected programs as listed in the following table:

Note:

1) **Applicants who do not have one of the Standard English Language Certificates indicated above MUST** take the CMU-English Placement Test. The test will be held on the same day as the examination for specialized subjects. Test fees must be paid with the application fee.

2) Applicants applying for DIN can alternatively submit result on an old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) or new SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing). Applicants who submit the above standardized results with a minimum score are subjected to enroll in Intensive Pre-sessional English Course held by International College of Digital Innovation, Chiang Mai University before the academic semester (June-July).

3) Applicants applying for NSC and ISNE who have graduated from an international high school or have graduated from a high school in a country where English is an official language and English is the means of instruction, these applicants do not need to submit an English Language Certificate (e.g. IELTS, TOEFL scores.).

4) TOEFL ITP Test must be conducted by institution or center accredited by the Institute of International Education (IIE).

5) Applicants in the 1<sup>st</sup> Intake for ECON must achieve IELTS with a minimum band score of 6.5 *or* TOEFL with a minimum score of 550 PBT or 213 CBT or 79 iBT. The minimum scores for ECON listed in the table above can apply for both the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Intakes.

### 3. ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

#### 3.1 Students who are studying in or graduated from the Thai educational system with

- **Mattayom Suksa diploma** are eligible to apply for DIN, ECON, IDEA, ISNE, ME, SE, SS, and ES.
- **International program diploma** are eligible apply for all programs, and need to be Non-Native Thai for TFL.

Students are required to have the latest minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) (5 semesters for those who are studying and 6 semesters for those who already graduated) as follows:

- 1) Minimum of 2.50 for DIN, IDEA, ISNE, ME, NSC, and TFL.
- 2) Minimum of 2.75 for SS.
- 3) No minimum requirement for ANI and MMIT.
- 4) Minimum of 3.00 for the 1<sup>st</sup> Intake, and minimum of 2.50 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Intakes for ECON.
- 5) Minimum of 2.5 for the 1<sup>st</sup> Intake, and no minimum are required for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Intake for SE.

#### 3.2 Students who have Standard Certifications that are equivalent to *Mattayom Suksa 6, the Thailand's High School Diploma.*

- 1) Students who have graduated from an international school in Thailand and have an equivalency certificate issued by the Thai Ministry of Education.
- 2) Students who have graduated from an overseas institution and have an equivalency certificate and accredited by the Thai Ministry of Education.
- 3) Applicants who submit an old GED (tested before May 2017) must pass all 5 subjects. Each subject must be passed with a minimum score of 410 and a minimum total score of 2,250, for a new GED (tested from May 2017 onward) must pass all 4 subjects. Each subject must be passed with a minimum score of 145.
- 4) Applicants who have results of IGCSE, GCSE or GCE 'O' level of 5 subjects with a minimum grade of C.
  - 4.1) For applicants who took the test in or before 2016 are required to have GCE 'AS' of 5 subjects (or more) with a grade from A to E, *or* GCE 'A' level of 3 subjects (or more) with a grade from A\* to E.
  - 4.2) For applicants who took the test from 2017 onward, the 5 subjects above must be all distinct, and must have GCE 'AS' of 3 subjects (or more) with minimum grade of C, *or* GCE 'A' level of 3 subjects (or more) with minimum grade of C.
- 5) Applicants who submit New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) which is under the New Zealand Qualification Authority (NZQA), must have a minimum of 80 credits, which consist of:
  - Subjects in level 2 or higher, not less than 60 credits.

- Subjects in level 1 or higher, not less than 20 credits.

English for Speaker of other Languages (ESOL) will be considered as 1 subject; applicants must submit NCEA level 2 certificate, Record of Achievement, Level confirmation letter, list of subjects and number of credits for each subject from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA).

- 6) Applicants who submit International Baccalaureate (IB) Certificate must have IB Diploma, in which the total score from 5 subjects groups plus 1 free elective subject is not less than 24 points and they have passed the Extended Essay (EE), Theory of Knowledge (TOK) and Creativity, Action & Service (CAS) evaluation, in accordance with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) criteria and have obtained the minimum grade of 4 in at least 5 non-duplicate subjects or have an IB Diploma Course Results (IBCR) with at least 5 non-duplicate subjects, where the grade of each subject is not less than 2 (equivalent to 60% of GPA or 2 or higher in each subject).
- 7) Applicants from the Chinese High School System must have their results in their field of study (Arts / Sciences) for at least 4 semesters, with a minimum average score of 60 out of 100 or 90 out of 150 and the full score for each subject must be shown in the transcript.
- 8) Applicants from the Myanmar Matriculation System must have a Matriculation Examination Pass Certificate and “O” Level Pass Certificate or Matriculation Examination Pass Certificate and transcripts of the first academic year in an undergraduate degree or diploma from an acknowledged university.

### 3.3 Additional Requirements

#### 3.3.1 Students who have graduated from or are studying in *Mattayom Suksa 6* in the Thai educational system (as per 3.1), who apply for

- **Mechanical Engineering** must have Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 in each subject.
- **Information Systems and Network Engineering** must have Physics and Mathematics with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 in each subject.
- **Software Engineering** must have Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in their transcript.
- **Nursing Science** (only for those who graduated are studying in international program) must have Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and English with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 in each subject.
- **Integrated Design in Emerging Architecture** must have Physics and Mathematics with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 in each subject.
- **Digital Innovation** must have English with a minimum CGPA of 2.75

### 3.3.2 Students who submit a Standard Certification Equivalency (as per 3.2) who apply for

- **Information Systems and Network Engineering** must have Physics and Mathematics in their transcript or they are listed in a standards test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Mechanical Engineering** must have Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics in their transcript or they are listed in a standards test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Software Engineering** must have Mathematics and one of following subjects: Physics or Chemistry or Biology in their transcript or it is listed in a standardized test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Modern Management and Information Technology** and **Animation and Game** must have Mathematics in their transcript or it is listed in a standardized test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Nursing Science** must have Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics in their transcript or they are in a standardized test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Integrated Design in Emerging Architecture** must have Physics and Mathematics in their transcript or they are listed in a standardized test (e.g. SAT Subject Tests, IGCSE).
- **Economics** for the **1<sup>st</sup> Intake** must have An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) or a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) with a minimum score of 500 in Mathematics.

### 3.4 Specialized subjects examination for each program and Track.

**3.4.1 For applicants in Track 1:** Applicants who are able to take the internal examination for specialized subjects and the CMU-English placement test, must take specialized subject tests based on program they apply to, as follows:

**3.4.2 For applicants in Track 2 :** Applicants who are unable to take the internal examination for specialized subjects and the CMU-English placement test but can provide results of their English Language Certificates (see item 2 above) and standardized examinations of specialized subjects in accordance to their applied program as follows:

- **Digital Innovation** must submit:
  - An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) *or* a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing)
- **Economics** must submit:
  - An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) *or* a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) with a minimum score of 500 in Mathematics.
- **Information Systems and Network Engineering and Mechanical Engineering** must submit :
  - An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) *or* a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) *and*
  - SAT Subject Tests in Mathematics Level II *and*
  - SAT Subject Tests in Physics
- **Software Engineering** must submit:
  - An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) *or* a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) *and*
  - SAT Subject Tests in Mathematics Level II *and*
  - SAT Subject Tests in one of the following subjects:  
Physics *or* Chemistry *or* Biology.
- **Animation and Game and Modern Management and Information Technology** must submit:
  - An Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) *or* a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) *and*
  - SAT Subject Tests in Mathematics Level II
- **Thai as a Foreign Language** must submit:
  - CU-TFL minimum level of “Intermediate” with score of I or above.

**5. TEST CENTERS**

Applicants must select one of the following test centers during their online application.

- 5.1) Chiang Mai University, Thailand for all Intakes.
- 5.2) Kunming, Yunnan, China for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Intakes.
- 5.3) Mae Sot Test center, Tak province, Thailand for the 4<sup>th</sup> Intake.

***Note: the examination location and room will be listed in the announcement of qualified applicants.***

**6. APPLICATION DOCUMENTS**

All applicants must complete the online application form and are required to submit clear and readable scanned documents (each file size not over 1 MB) as follows:

- 6.1) A scanned copy of high school graduation certificate/diploma for *Matayom Suksa 6*, or Grade 12 or Equivalent, Thai or English, or its foreign equivalent. (If not in English, please submit the original document with an official English translation).
- 6.2) A verification letter of current student status (if studying).

6.3) A scanned copy of official high school transcript, Thai or English, or its foreign equivalent.

6.4) An Official Certificate of English Language ability (if any).

6.5) For Thai citizens: a scanned copy of the Thai National I.D. Card.

For non-Thai citizens: a scanned copy of Passport (recommended for a quick visa process) or a scanned copy of the National I.D. card with official English translation.

6.6) Health certificate, Thai or English, issued within the last 6 months.

Applicants who apply for the **Nursing Science** program must submit a Health certificate confirming that he/she is in good health, with no visual problems including severe color blindness. Also applicants must self-certify this in their online application that he/she does not have other illnesses, symptoms, or disabilities which would be an obstacle to their study (see item 1.3 above). Once applicants have been accepted into the program, there will be a complete health checkup according to item 1.3 above; applicants will be disqualified if they do not meet any of the health requirements.

6.7) 2x2 inches, full-face, formal photograph taken within the last 6 months (in jpg format).

6.8) Applicants who apply for the **DIN program in the 1<sup>st</sup> Intake** are required to submit a personal portfolio, and must have an English proficiency test results/ experience *or* online start-up/online business experience (no more than 10 pages of A4 sized paper).

6.9) Applicants who apply for the **ECON program in the 1<sup>st</sup> Intake** must submit a portfolio that

- 1) Includes an applicant's profile, awards, or activities in academic or other relevant fields that he/she has got or experienced in a high school level.
- 2) Does not exceed 10 pages.
- 3) Includes a result of IELTS with a minimum band score of 6.5 *or* TOEFL with a minimum score of 550 PBT or 213 CBT or 79 iBT.
- 4) Includes a result of an Old SAT (Mathematics, Critical Reading and Writing) or a New SAT (Mathematics and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) with a minimum score of 500 in Mathematics.
- 5) Includes the latest transcript 5 semesters for those who are studying and 6 semesters for those who are already graduated in Thai educational system with a minimum CGPA of 3.00. For non-Thai applicants, applicants must submit one of the standard certifications according to the requirements mentioned in item 3.2.

6.10) Applicants who apply for the **IDEA program** are required to submit the following additional documents:

1) Personal Art portfolio, design and handicraft (no more than 10 of A4 sized sheets, in PDF format, with the file size not over 16 MB).

2) Statement of Purpose, stating their interest in the program and their intentions for their future (no more than 2 of A4 sized sheets in PDF format, with the file size not over 1 MB).

3) Reference Letter (no more than 2 of A4 sized sheets in PDF format, with the file

size not over 1 MB) from a homeroom teacher, a guidance counselor, or a teacher who can certify the student's portfolio work as well as his/her ability, talents, and development.

**Important Remarks** : If any documents submitted are found to be fraudulent, applicants will automatically be disqualified.

### 7.1) Application Fee (Non-refundable) : 1,200 Thai Baht

- For applicants in Track 1 who select a Test Center in Thailand.
- For applicants in Track 2.

### 7.2) Application Fee (Non-refundable) : 2,500 Thai Baht

- For applicants in Track 1 who select the Test Center in China.

### 7.3) English Placement Test Fee (Non-refundable) : 400 Thai Baht

- For applicants in Track 1 who **do not** have an English Language Certificate.

**7.4) Payment Methods:** Chiang Mai University must receive the fee(s) in full in order for the application to be processed.

*Applicant is responsible for all related fees incurred on both the sender and receiver account.*

9.1) All candidates must show their Thai I.D. card or passport or national I.D. card with official English translation on the examination date. Otherwise, they will not be allowed to take the examination.

9.2) Candidates who arrive at the examination room later than 15 minutes after the start time will not be allowed to sit the examination.

9.3) Candidates are only allowed to bring their I.D. card or passport or national I.D. card with official English translation and writing utensils into the examination room.

**Remarks:** Candidates must strictly follow the examination rules. If a candidate has been found cheating in any way, CMU wholly reserves the right to disqualify such a candidate.


