Chiang Mai University Undergraduate Admission Announcement for International Programs for the 2023 Academic Year (NO. 2)

Chiang Mai University is now open applications of the international undergraduate programs in Bachelor of Accountancy (ACC) for Round 3 of the 2023 academic year.

1. ACCEPTANCE NUMBERS

20 Students

2. APPLICANTS QUALIFICATIONS

2.1) Academic qualification

Graduated from or studying in the final term of Matthayom Suksa 6 (M.6) or its equivalent under the following conditions,

- 1. Graduated from or studying in M.6 in Thailand secondary education system or
- 2. Graduated from an international school in Thailand or
- 3. Graduated from an overseas institution/have certificated in the list of secondary education equivalency system in **Annex 1**

There is **no** minimum required for the cumulative grade point average (CGPA) (5 terms for those who are studying and 6 terms for those who have already graduated).

2.2) English proficiency qualification

1. <u>Non-native English speakers</u> or English is not an official language must meet their English proficiency requirement based on the chosen program of study. The following minimum scores of the Standard English Language Certificates are required.

Note:

- ACC also accepts the following accredited English proficiency tests: CMU-eTEGs 65 or above; CU-TEP 70 or above; TU-GET (PBT) 500 or above and (CBT) 70 or above.
- ii) Non-native English speakers who do not have the required standard English proficiency test **must take the CMU English placement test**.
- 2. <u>Non-native English speakers are exempt</u> from the English proficiency requirement under the following conditions,
 - a. who are from a country where English is an official language.
 - b. who have completed an international program or graduated from an institution in a country where English is the language of instruction.

3. <u>Native English speakers are exempt</u> from the English proficiency requirement.

2.3) Other qualifications

- 1. Must have no record of serious misconduct and must agree to abide strictly by the rules and regulations of the university.
- 2. Must not have a serious contagious disease or any disease that will obstruct their studies.
- 3. See **Annex 2** for the program-specific requirements.

3. APPLICATION TRACKS AND SUBJECT TESTS

There are 2 admission tracks available for applicants;

3.1) Regular Track

(For applicants who do **not** have **either** 1. Standard English Proficiency Test or 2. Standard subject test.) Applicants **must take subject tests (CMU exam)** according to the applied program.


3.2) Special Track

(For applicants who have **both** 1. Standard English Proficiency Test and 2. Standard subject test) Applicants **must submit standardized examinations** of specialized subjects of applied program as follows;

4. ADMISSION PROCESS

Applications must be submitted online through the CMU International Program Admission System (IPAS) at http://www1.reg.cmu.ac.th/reg-ipas/. In this system, applicants select the program and application track. For Regular Track applicants, after application review, qualified applicants must take CMU's internal exams, followed by an interview. For Special Track applicants, qualified applicants will be invited for an interview after application review.



5. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR ADMISSION

All applicants must complete the online application form and are required to submit clear and readable scanned documents (each file size not over 1 MB) as follows:

- 1. A scanned copy of the high school graduation certificate for Mattayom Suksa 6, or Grade 12 or equivalent, Thai or English, or the foreign equivalent. (If not in English, please submit the original document with an official English translation) or a certificate of current student status (if studying).
- 2. A scanned copy of the official high school transcript, Thai or English, or the foreign equivalent (if not in Thai or English, please submit the original document with an official English translation).
- 3. An official certificate of English language proficiency (if available).
- 4. For Thai citizens: a scanned copy of the Thai National ID Card.
- 5. For non-Thai citizens: a scanned copy of passport.
- 6. One 2x2 inch-photo in school uniform or in formal dress taken within the last 6 months (in jpg format).
- 7. Additional documents required by the chosen program (see Annex 2).

Remark: If any submitted documents are found to be fraudulent, applicants will automatically be disqualified.

6. WRITTEN EXAMINATION AND INTERVIEW

6.1) For Regular Track Applicants (Online Written Examination and Interview) The schedule for CMU's internal subject examinations and English placement test is as follows. Details of the online exams and interview will be sent to applicant emails submitted during the application process.

7. APPLICATION FEES AND PAYMENT METHODS

7.1) Application fee (non-refundable): 1,200 Thai Baht (per program)

7.2) English Placement Test Fee (non-refundable): 400 Thai Baht

Methods of payment

Chiang Mai University must receive the fee(s) in full **(excluding transferring fee)** in order to process the application. Payment can be made by;

- 1) **QR code** during the application process. (No fee and real time update) <u>or</u>
- 2) **Credit card** (2.3% for processing fee) *or*
- 3) **Payment at the counter service** (in Thailand only) with the printed payment form from the application system.

10. VISA DOCUMENT REQUEST FOR ADMITTED APPLICANTS

To apply for Thai visa, accepted foreign applicants MUST request their official visa application documents via CMU-IRD-VISA Online within 1 week after accepting the offer in IPAS at https://ird.cmu.ac.th/visa-online.

The International Relations Department of Chiang Mai University (CMU-IRD) will send the documents required for the visa application to the email address provided by the applicant during the application process. Hard copies or originals of the documents are available upon request with a mailing fee of approximately 1,000 Thai Baht for an international address and approximately 60 Thai Baht for a domestic address. Foreign applicants will not be able to enter Thailand or extend their existing visa in Thailand without the official application documents obtained through CMU-IRD-VISA Online.

11. HEALTH INSURANCE AGREEMENT FOR ADMITTED APPLICANTS

Admitted applicants are required to purchase health insurance while studying at Chiang Mai University. This insurance may be purchased upon arrival on the advice of the faculty. Applicants who have already obtained international insurance in their home country must provide proof of accident and health insurance coverage for this waiver.

12. NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION PROCESS FOR ADMITTED APPLICANTS

Admitted applicants must resubmit admission documents (#1 - #5 in item 5, above) and upload the documents between **June 6** -**9**, **2023** through the new student registration system at www3.reg.cmu.ac.th/stdinfo/undergraduate/.

Remarks

- 1. Students who provide incorrect information or use false documents in any registration process will have their student status revoked.
- 2. Students who fail to register online as a new student within 10 business days of the enrollment schedule will be automatically disqualified.

Annex 1

Thailand certificate of secondary education (Matthayom Suksa 6) equivalency system

1. British System

- General Certificate of Education Advanced Level (GCE A Level) with grade results A*-E on at least 3 different subjects, or
- o Cambridge Pre-U with grade result M1 or D1-D3 on at least 3 different subjects.

2. American System

- o General Educational Development (GED) Credential obtained before May 2017 with minimum total score 2250 on all 5 subjects and at least 410 points on each subject, or
- General Educational Development (GED) Credential obtained from May 2017 with minimum score 145 on all 4 subjects.

3. New Zealand System

National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Record of Achievement: At least 80 credits achieved (60 credits at Level 2 or above + 20 credits at Level 1 or above), with English for Speaker of other Languages (ESOL) considered as a subject.

Applicants must submit NCEA level 2 certificate, Record of Achievement, Level certification letter, list of subjects and number of credits for each subject from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA).

4. International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP)

- o International Baccalaureate Diploma with the total score from 5 subjects and 1 free elective at least 24 points. Applicants must pass the Extended Essay (EE), Theory of Knowledge (TOK) and Creativity, Action & Service (CAS) evaluation, in accordance with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) criteria, or
- IB Diploma Course Results (IBCR) with not less than grade 3 on at least 5 different subjects

5. Business and Technology Education Council (BTEC)

 BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma with grade results D*-P. Applicants must have PEARSON Level 3 BTEC Subsidiary Diploma of Year 12 - 13 in 3 subjects: Business, Travel and Tourism, and Sport accompanied by a High School Diploma.

6. Other high school diplomas

- High school diploma from an *international school in Thailand* with an equivalency certificate issued by the Ministry of Education, Thailand, or
- o High school diploma from an *international school oversea* with an equivalency certificate issued by the Ministry of Education, Thailand, or
- High school diploma in *Chinese High School System* must have a minimum average score of 60 out of 100 or 90 out of 150 in their field of study (Arts/Sciences) for at least 4 semesters and the maximum score for each subject must be presented in the transcript.
- High school diploma in the *Myanmar Matriculation System* with a Matriculation Examination Pass Certificate and either
 - a. "O" Level Pass Certificate or
 - b. Transcripts of the first academic year in an undergraduate degree or diploma from an acknowledged university.
- For education systems from countries not mentioned above, check the foreign academic qualifications from the Ministry of Education's announcement on the Education Equivalency System, January 18, 2002. (https://cmu.to/AnnexTCAS66 in Thai)

7. Other Vocational School diploma

- Students who graduated from Vocational School in Chinese system must have a minimum average score of 60 out of 100 or 90 out of 150 in their field of study (Arts/Sciences) and the maximum score for each subject must be presented in the transcript.
- Students who graduated from Vocational School in other system must have a diploma equivalent to or higher than the Vocational School system of Thailand. (Check the foreign academic qualification at https://cmu.to/AnnexTCAS66 in Thai)
